

## **Pupil Premium Planned Expenditure 2016/17**

For the academic year 2016/17, 184 students are registered as 'Pupil Premium' at The Kingswinford School.

This will create estimated funding for the school of £175,840.

The main barriers to our PP students include:

- weak literacy and numeracy skills
- low attainment on entry in English and Maths
- lack of engagement/aspiration
- engaging in low level disruptive behaviour

To target these barriers the PP funding will be used to provide:

- Additional teaching staff, lessons and groups in the core subject areas of Maths and English.
- Additional literacy support for reading comprehension in KS3.
- Additional staffing for pastoral interventions to reduce exclusions and increase attendance.
- Additional teaching assistant staffing specifically to monitor and support the progress of Pupil Premium students and to identify individual needs.
- Specialised interventions for targeted students in Y11 to accelerate end of Key Stage progress.
- Support for targeted students with regard to the provision of specific resources.

The impact of the spending of the Pupil Premium funding will be measured against national data, where possible. Internal data, together with pastoral monitoring, will be used to monitor the progress and attainment of Pupil Premium students.

The review of spending will take place in April 2017.
